

Affordable Housing: Quarterly Progress Q1: June 30, 2022

In Budget 2018, the Provincial Government announced Homes for BC, 114,000 units which included the largest investment in housing affordability in B.C.'s history. To date, more than 35,000 of these homes are completed, in progress or underway throughout the province. As of June 30, 2022, BC Housing has 27,590 new affordable homes either complete or underway through the ten-year plan.

Building the Homes that People Need

BC Housing works hard to provide a range of affordable housing options for people with very low incomes, low-to-moderate incomes, and middle incomes.




Very Low Income Low to Moderate Income Middle Income

Rental Supplement Programs

Through rental assistance programs, BC Housing helps low-income working families, seniors, youth and those who are at-risk of, or experiencing homelessness find an continue to have places to call home.

The rent supplements are portable, meaning households can live and move anywhere in B.C. and still receive the same monthly rent subsidy amount.

RAP gives eligible low-income working families, who have at least one dependent child, cash assistance to help with their monthly rent payments.
