

Intimate Partner Violence Safety Planning Online Training

This online **Intimate Partner Violence Safety Planning Training** is provided by the [Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General](#) (PSSG). It replaces the Domestic Violence Safety Planning Online Training that was originally developed through a partnership between the MPSSG and BC Housing, in collaboration with the [Ending Violence Association of BC](#), [BC Society of Transition Houses](#), and [Police Victim Services of BC](#).

The training is a practical resource to assist support workers in safety planning with survivors, their children, and families impacted by intimate partner violence. The training includes foundational elements and tools for safety planning that can be adapted to different circumstances.

The **5-6 hour** online domestic violence safety planning training consists of 3 modules covering a range of topics including:

- Intimate-Partner Violence and Approaches to Safety
- Identifying Risks and Collaborating Across Sectors
- Working with Survivors to Develop Safety Plans

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The training will be available to **support workers, management staff, volunteers and practicum students** that meet the following requirements:

- Work for a BC Housing funded by Women's Transition Housing & Supports Program or Supportive Housing Program
- Have consent to take the training from their employer
- Confirm that you understand you have 60 days to complete the training, from the day when your username and password are emailed to you. If the course is not completed, re-enrollment will not be available again for one year from your registration date

Does it cost money to take the training?

BC Housing will pay the online registration fee but will not be able to cover any additional costs associated with taking the training (for example, worker time).

Will I receive a certificate for completing the training?

Each learner who completes the training will be able to download a 'Certificate of Completion' by following the instructions at the end of the training.
